PUBLIC POLICY

AAUW has a strong mission on public policy. As stated on the AAUW Public Policy national website:

"Since AAUW's founding our members and supporters have spoken out about policies important to women and girls."

"AAUW's policy work connects and rallies advocates at the local, state, national, and global levels to advance our work to empower women and girls. With the memberendorsed Public Policy Priorities as our guide, AAUW uses lobbying and grassroots efforts to push forward policies that break through educational and economic barriers for women."

"The AAUW Public Policy and Government Relations Department, with input from the member leaders of the AAUW Public Policy Committee, leads AAUW's lobbying and grassroots efforts."

What does this mean for our branch? As Texans, we see the need for advocacy in many of the areas outlined in the Public Policy Priorities guidelines. For example, gender pay gap, expanding voting rights, and increased access to quality, affordable health care and family planning services, including expansion of patient's rights are significant issues facing women at the state and national level.

The national median annual earnings of women compared with men's is 80%. For every dollar earned by a man, a woman in a comparable job would receive only \$.80. In Texas the median is 79%. Also, Texas is ranked as a state with poor equal pay protections as outlined by law.

Over the last few years health care and family planning services and voting rights are becoming increasingly restricted by our state legislature in Texas. Both issues have suffered setbacks in the last two state legislative sessions.

The AAUW Public Policy Committee provides a wealth of in-depth information and statistics to support informed and effective advocacy on the part of AAUW members.

AAUW FUNDS CORNER

AAUW Texas Says "It Is Time to Complete the Ann Richards American Fellowship!"

In October 2008, AAUW Texas established a new Educational Opportunities Foundation fellowship fund in honor of former Governor Ann Richards. It was approved by AAUW Board and assigned the fund number **4324**.

Ann Richards was an American politician and the 45th Governor of the great state of Texas! She began as a teacher and moved into politics. While Texas state treasurer, she came to national political attention when she delivered the keynote address at the 1988 Democratic National Convention. Her career path and achievements meshed with AAUW's mission: teacher, political activist, county commissioner, state treasurer (first woman elected to statewide office in more than fifty years), a candidate who appealed to suburban voters as well as to the traditional Democratic base, and then governor. Although officially she was the second woman to hold Texas' top office, Richards is considered the first woman elected governor in her own right.

AAUW American Fellowships support women doctoral candidates completing dissertations and scholars seeking funds for postdoctoral research leave or for preparing completed research for publication. Fellowship funds must reach \$200,000 to be fully endowed and awarded.

Donations to the Ann Richards Fellowship received between now and the April 2018 state convention in Houston will be matched dollar for dollar by AAUW Texas. As an additional incentive, AAUW Texas created "Sisters of Ann" for those who donate \$250 or more between January 1, 2018, and March 1, 2018. Sisters of Ann will receive a yellow rose pin and will be recognized in the 2018 AAUW Texas State Convention program. All branches that donate during this time will also receive special recognition at the 2018 State Convention.

EXPANDING YOUR HORIZONS 2017-2018



The mission of AAUW is:

"Advancing equity for women and girls through advocacy, education, philanthropy, and research."

The West Harris County Branch has for the last 25 years organized and presented Expanding Your Horizons, a one-day conference for middle school girls to inspire them in the pursuit of a career in the Science, Technology, Engineering or Mathematics (STEM) fields. EYH has been this branch's primary project in advancing the mission of AAUW.

We are still looking for volunteers for EYH 2018 which will take place on **February 24, 2018**.

Open positions on the Steering Committee are: Assistant Chair and Presenter Training Dinner Coordinator.

We also need to train the next Registrar, currently being coordinated by Hazel Chahar. This is the job description for the registrar:

Expanding Your Horizons Registrar:

The Registrar works in conjunction with the Treasurer to take the submitted registration forms and enter them into a database where assignments are made for the conference sessions. You will work with both Microsoft Excel and Access to complete the process. Data entry assistance is possible at the front end, with helpers working from their homes on their own computers via the internet. Files are exported to Excel, cleaned and checked and then imported into an Access database, which has been loaded with Speaker names, room assignments and session numbers. Once all registrants are loaded into Access, a program will assign sessions to each adult or student based on their desired sessions – if possible. Some manual review and changes are needed. Once the data appears complete, badges are printed and school packets are compiled, to be distributed at the conference.
