A Visit to the Heart of the Old Three Hundred Settlement -- Richmond/Rosenberg

Join us on **Thursday, May 16**, as we continue the saga of Austin's Old 300 with a visit to Richmond and Rosenberg, Texas. Sixty-six of the 300 original Austin land grants were in the Richmond area. Early settlers constructed a block house on the Brazos River to protect against Indian raids, but the river long ago reclaimed what is now historic Fort Bend. We will follow the steps of Richmond's early Republic of Texas residents such as Jane Long, Erastus "Deaf" Smith and Mirabeau B. Lamar; observe the Richmond Depot of the first railroad in Texas established in 1855 -- The Buffalo Bayou, Brazos and Colorado; and tour the historic 1909 County Courthouse which has been restored through the THC Historic Courthouse program. Before leaving Richmond, we'll stop at the Morton Cemetery to see the graves of Jane Long and Mirabeau B. Lamar. After lunching at Another Time Cafe, we will conclude our visit with a trip to the Rosenberg Railroad Museum.

Our knowledgeable guide for the day will be noted Texas historian Melissa Dixon, a long-time resident of Houston, current resident of Rosenberg, and owner/operator of Texas Tour Connection.

We'll meet our Precinct 3 bus at the usual location on the south side of Barryknoll directly across from the Cinemark Theater in Memorial City Mall. We will leave promptly at 9:30 a.m. and expect to return by 4:00 p.m. Total cost for the day's events will be \$29, which includes your lunch plus the usual \$1 for our driver's lunch.
