#### A Visit to MFAH's Newly Consolidated Art Conservation Lab

Join other AAUW art enthusiasts as we kick off the Cultural Activities program year on **Wednesday**, **September 25**, with a visit to the recently consolidated Center for Conservation at the Museum of Fine Arts, followed by a leisurely lunch at Brennan's of Houston. Our host and tour guide is Per Knutas, the newly appointed Chairman of the Department of Conservation, who began his tenure at MFAH in July.

The state-of-the-art Center for Conservation, built atop the MFAH parking garage on Fannin, brings the Museum's distinguished conservation teams together in one of the largest, continuous spaces for conservation of any public museum. The one-hour tour will include a walk-through of the space with visits to each of the labs including paintings, frame, objects and sculpture, and decorative arts. We'll have the opportunity to observe the team of conservators and research scientists who evaluate the MFAH collection of nearly 70,000 objects, review works of art being considered for acquisition as well as examine and acclimatize objects on loan from other institutions.

Other than the customary \$1.00 we collect from everyone for the bus driver, your lunch at Brennan's is your only expense. The tour of the Center for Conservation is free!
