Personally, equal pay has been a life changer for me. Knowing that I am under paid, over worked, and would never catch up is horrifying. During class, I mentioned not being sure if I could stand up for myself. Realizing all I had to lose was a low paying job or a bad company to work for (if they didn't address salary negotiation). With God on my side, I decided to negotiate the salary. I called. No answer. I called again. No answer. So, I emailed. The email stated my enthusiasm for having an opportunity to work for their company and enthusiasm for getting into a career I would enjoy. I asked for \$10,000 more than the salary they initially stated was non-negotiable. I also asked for a signing bonus. They countered with the increased base salary of \$10,000!!!!!

Awareness is key and not being afraid to ask is also key. Thank you, Dr. Taylor for the awareness of equal pay. Your class was priceless!!!!!!
