Be an Informed Voter on March 5th

Important 2024 Primary Election Dates

Last Day to Register to Vote - February 5
Deadline to apply for a ballot by mail - February 23
Early Voting - February 20th through March 1
Primary Election - March 5
Primary Runoff Election (If Necessary) - May 28
General Election - November 5



Super Tuesday is March 5th. You have time to prepare. The primary decides the Democratic and Republican nominees in local, state, and national races and can significantly shape the future of our communities.

While this election is considered a primary, in a few races it may actually elect the candidate. That occurs when an incumbent of one party is opposed by another candidate of the same party and no candidate is running from the opposing party. The candidate who wins the primary election will then be unopposed in the General Election and will automatically be elected.

This year, there are a number of incumbents who are opposed by another candidate of the same party. Prominent politicians in both parties are opposing some of their own parties' incumbents who broke with them on high-profile issues.

Local races affect us the most with day-to-day decisions made by local office holders on essential services and resources in our immediate communities. Some local politicians use their offices to become better known and later run for state or national offices.

Make a voting plan ahead of Election Day. Registered Texas voters can vote in either the Republican or the Democratic primary regardless of your political persuasion. You cannot vote in both primaries. Choose the one you wish to vote in.

Look up and print your sample ballot. With redistricting your representatives may have changed.

Research the candidates ahead of time. Check out their views and voting records. AAUW suggests that you support those who endorse key issues: pay equity, public education, diversity, women's health choices, child care availability, diversity of school reading material, i.e., freedom to read, etc. Add your own concerns to the list. The League of Women's Voter's online guide at Vote 411 (vote411.org) is nonpartisan and will be "live" starting February 2, 2024.

Complete your sample ballot and take it with you to your polling place. You can use it when you VOTE!

On Thursday, February 15th, the Honeys will visit Memorial Park, Houston's largest urban greenspace. Memorial Park contains 1,500 acres, twice the size of Central Park in New York City.

Memorial Park was established in 1924 and is currently celebrating its 100th year. The park has been transformed over the past several years, first with the overhaul of the park's golf course and facilities, followed by the creation of the Eastern Glades. The Glades were formerly inaccessible parklands that have now been converted into a natural environment. Additionally, the development of the Land Bridge over Memorial Drive has added 25 acres of natural prairie over six lanes of traffic. Marilyn Watson and Ann Hebert will co-

lead the Hiking Honeys on a route beginning with the Eastern Glades followed by taking the Seymour Lieberman Trail to the Kinder Land Bridge. Byway Birders


